<p>AESCULUS CALIFORNICA</p>	<p>CALIFORNIA BUCKEYE</p>	<p>CRAZY LOVE WITH NATIVE POLLINATORS BUT TOXIC TO EUROPEAN HONEYBEES - BUT GOOD NEWS- THEY ONLY USE IT IF IT'S A LAST RESORT VERY UNCOMMONLY - PLANT A BUNCH OF NATIVES FOR YOUR EUROPEAN FRIENDS AND THEY WILL BE FINE - THIS IS WHEN WE PLANT SOME SMELLY LAVENDER...</p>
<p>ARCTOSTAPHYLOS 'SUNSET' OR 'HOWARD MCMINN'</p>	<p>MANZANITA</p>	<p>These two selections are extremely garden tollerant and provide winter nectar and pollen sources.</p>
<p>BACCHARIS PILULARIS</p>	<p>COYOTE BERRY</p>	<p>-</p>
<p>RHAMNUS CALIFORNICA (SYN. FRANGULA CALIFORNIA)</p>	<p>COFFEE BERRY</p>	<p>Literally COVERED with Bees in the early spring - amazing .</p>
<p>SPHAERALCEA AMBIGUA</p>	<p>DESERT MALLOW</p>	<p>Desert plant so not great with cold areas - use rock mulch to warm it up. Gorgous and flowering Spring to Fall. Beautiful apricot colored flowers. Great combination with Matillija Poppy (Romneya coulterii).</p>
<p>SPHAERALCEA INCANUM</p>	<p>GLOBE MALLOW</p>	<p>A wonderful spreading apricot colored perennial. In one year this plant can grow 5' tall and wide. Combine with Matillija poppy and Califnorni lilac species like Ceanothus 'Dark Star' for a stunning hedge covered with pollinators!</p>

<p>ACHILLEA MILLEFOLIUM</p>	<p>YARROW</p>	<p>Common yarrow is beautiful mixed with grasses in a meadow effect or at the edge of a hedge row (see above shrubs). White flowers in umbels provide a great structure for pollinators in the garden to land on.</p>
<p>SOLIDAGO SPP.</p>	<p>GOLDENROD</p>	<p>SUMMER BLOOMING SPREADER</p>
<p>ASTER CHILOENSIS</p>	<p>ASTER</p>	<p>Another amazing bloomer and spreader in the garden - easy to pull if it ends up spreading too much. The flower of the aster family is the most common and greatly appreciated by native pollinators.</p>

ERIOGONUM SP	BUCKWHEAT	MY FAVORITE: ERIOGONUM 'WARREN LYTTLE' is a low fast growing groundcover with a multitude of flowers for many months!
MONARDELLA SP	MINT / PENNYROYAL	Every time I hike in the Sierras I see this plant covered with butterflies, moths and bumblebees....
SALVIA CLEVELANDII	CLEVELAND'S SAGE	A great and beautiful flowering perennial that just blooms its self to death in some gardens. Doesn't really appreciate our long wet winters (when they happen) but is totally worth the price of a 4" container (4 bucks!) that will triple its size in one year and bloom its heart out for your pollinators.
